Arthur Benjamin Philip Langton is the patriarch of this family in Canada. This is his story...

Arthur Benjamin Philip Langton, better known as Phil, was born in 1921 in St Olave, London, England, son of Benjamin Langton and Ellen Stone. He grew up to become a soldier and an office employee of Esso Oil. He married Eileen Muriel Wilkins on 13 Oct 1945 in Wandsworth, London, England, daughter of James Wilkins and Elizabeth Cook. She was born on 11 Jul 1926 in Southfields, South London, England. Together they had three daughters; Jaqueline Susan, Deborah, and Kim Philippa.

In 1955, with Eileen's sister Christine, Phil and Eileen emigrated from England to Canada. When they had settled in Peterborough, Ont., Eileen's three daughters were brought by her mother to join them. The family also lived in Alberta until Philip's death on 03 Aug 1981, and then Eileen moved to Victoria. Eileen suffered a stroke that paralysed her right side. She died on 28 Dec 2009 in Mount St. Mary Hospital.

Jacqueline Susan Langton married Peter Douglas Gordon on 18 Dec 1965 in Peterborough, Ontario.

Deborah Langton married Randolph Richard Hoar on 14 Apr 1974 in Ely, Cambridgeshire, England.

Kim Phillipa Langton married Stephen George Cooke on 07 May 1977 in Calgary, Alberta. He died on 11 Aug 1979.

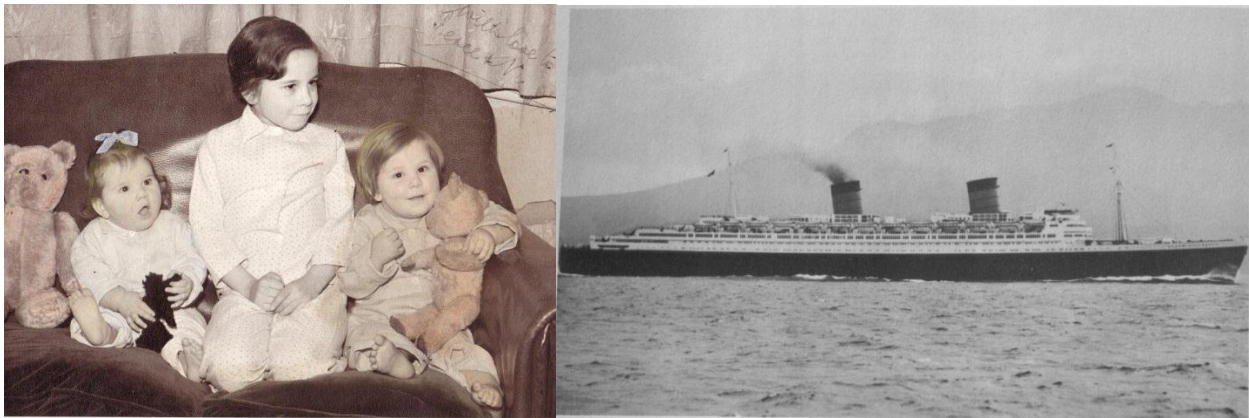

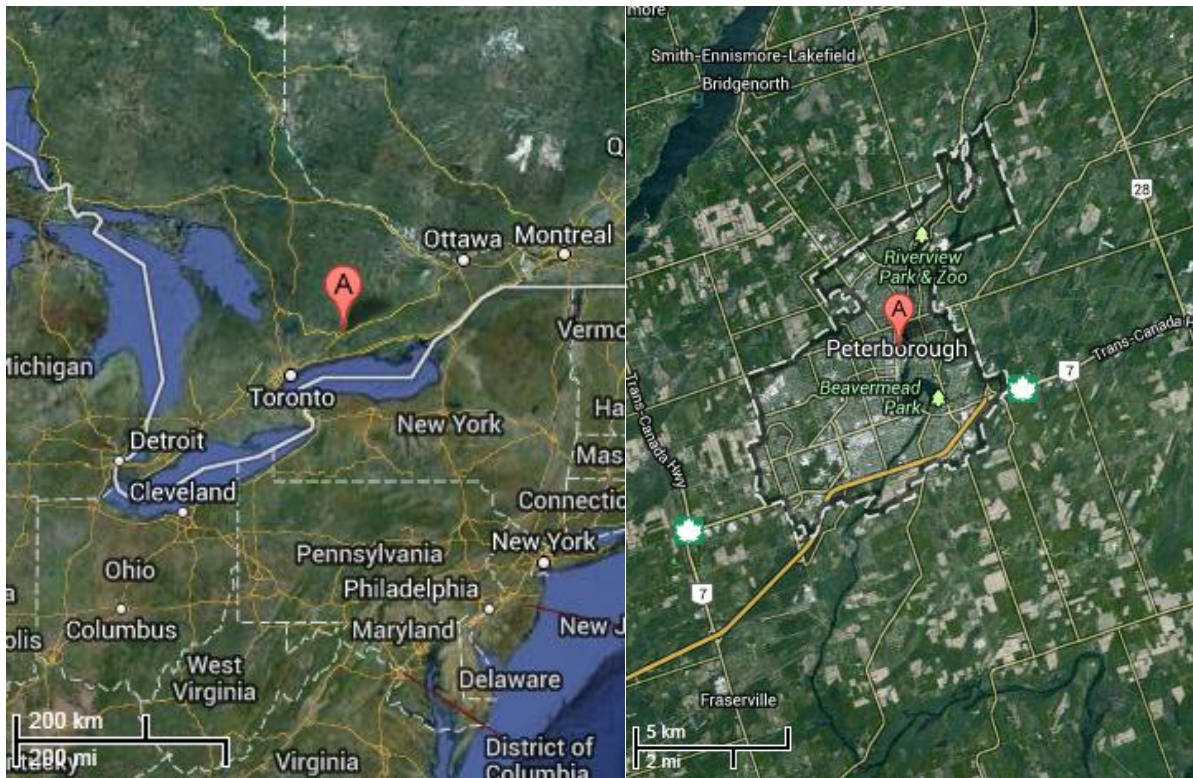

The earliest known ancestor in England is Francis Langton of Knaresborough, Yorkshire. He was born in about 1801 and died in 1846. He married Mary Lucas on 02 Nov 1819 in Knaresborough. Francis Langton's ancestors were most likely three consecutive Benjamin Langtons of Yorkshire.

Arthur Benjamin Philip Langton who came to Canada in 1955 would be the first Benjamin's 5x great grandson. The line of descent is suggested to be as follows:
