Edwin Ralph Langton is the patriarch of this family in Canada. This is his story...

Edwin Ralph Langton was born on 01 May 1852 in Hanwell, Middlesex, England. He died on 20 Aug 1930 in Sillery, Quebec, Canada. He married (1) Ruth Winkworth on 27 Jun 1872 in Uxbridge, Middlesex, England, daughter of William Winkworth and Esther Maskell. She was born about 1844 in Newbury, Berkshire, England. She died on 31 Aug 1894 in Hillingdon, Middlesex, England. He married (2) Martha Elizabeth Steel Penney on 26 Oct 1886 in Sillery, Quebec, Canada. She was born on 01 Nov 1862 in Sillery, Quebec. She died on 04 Oct 1940 in Sillery, Quebec, Canada.

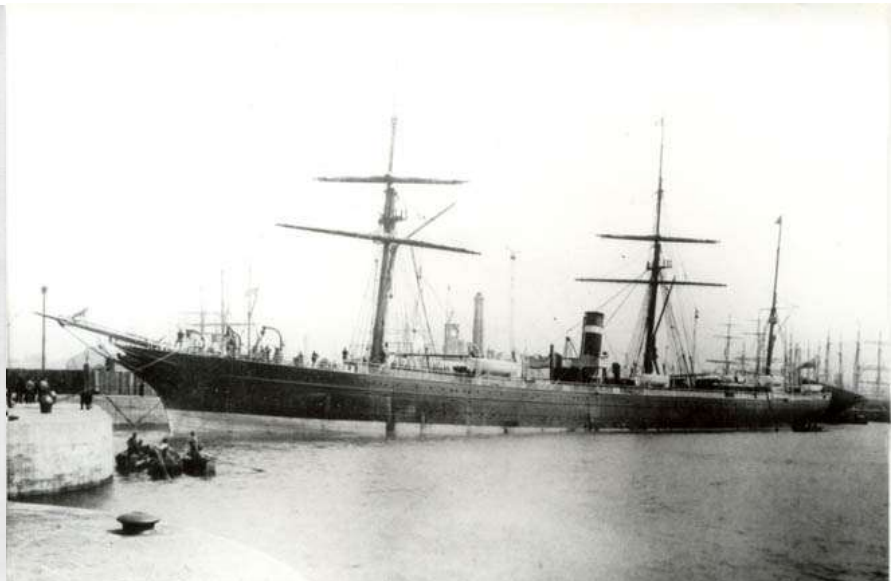
According to a story that David Edwin Livingston Langton once told to his cousin Wined Dorothy Candler Avery nee Langton... *Edwin Ralph and his first wife would have had a son together. Both mother and child were said to have died in Australia, because of a "BUG". It is not clear at all if the word "BUG" refers to a virus or an insect bite...* The story is most likely a collection of half-truths. Edwin Ralph and Ruth did go to Australia, but the circumstances of their separation are still unknown. It is a fact that Ruth Winkworth died in England eight years after Edwin Ralph re-married in Canada. Technically speaking, Edwin Ralph Langton was a bigamist. Perhaps the story David told Wined originated as a fable from Edwin Ralph himself; a cover story for what really happened.

Edwin Ralph is believed to have arrived for the first time in Canada aboard the Circassian, on the 18th of June, 1883. He initially went to Desoronto, Ontario, where he likely worked in the experimental gardens owned by the Rathbun Company. His first two sons, William Andrews and John Usmar, were born in Ontario. He then moved to St. Hyacinthe, Quebec, where his next two children, Ann Andrews and Henry "Harry" Henderson, were born. Eventually, he settled in Sillery, Quebec, where he had his last child, Ruth Penney. Perhaps she was named after his late first wife.

James Langton was born about 1752. He died about 1822. He married Mary (a.k.a. Polly) Town on 04 April 1777 in St. Mary Church, Denham, Buckinghamshire. She was born about 1752. All of their four known children were baptised at St. John the Baptist Church, Hillingdon, Middlesex.

- William Langton wife Ann Sophia Ringer nee Andrews
